Including a legacy to a registered charity such as Falklands Conservation can reduce an estate's inheritance tax burden.

These islands are truly special, and by coming together we can all work towards a bright future for the wildlife and nature of the Falkland Islands. Through advocacy, conservation-focused research, hands-on conservation work, and community engagement, we work towards our vision of a well-functioning natural environment, managed by those living closest to it.

This work takes time and dedication but with thanks to continued support from many sources, positive change can happen. Between 2012 and 2017 the black-browed albatross went from Endangered to a species of least conservation concern, and in 2021 we saw the nearshore waters of the Falkland Islands confirmed a Key Biodiversity Area for Endangered sei whales—the first such site in the world, and a global recognition of just how nature-rich and incredible our coastal areas are.

There is much work still to be done, but with your support we will continue to restore and conserve our incredible flora and fauna, ensuring that the vibrant ecosystems of the Falkland Islands can flourish long into the future.

Legacies help us to:

- Safeguard colonies of penguins and albatrosses
- Inspire and educate young islanders to care for their natural heritage
- Restore key habitats by planting native flora and removing invasive species
- Advise and assist government and landowners to care for the nature under their guardianship
- Care for our own island sites and nature reserves, including the fantastic New Island archipelago
- Research wildlife populations and behaviours to benefit conservation efforts.
