Conservation Ball 2024

POSSIBLY the most popular event in the Falklands social calendar, the Conservation Ball took place on Saturday evening.

It is Falklands Conservation's main fund-raising event, and includes a live auction of some superb items including local artwork and an Antarctic Cruise.

The evening began with a champagne reception with canapes. There then followed a two course meal. Food was provided by The Malvina House Hotel.

The highlight of the evening had been a closely guarded secret for some weeks, as FC had secured special guest Miss Dolly Le Chey as auctioneer.

Under her gentle encouragement, bids rose for several key items, including original paintings by Ben Cockwell (\pounds 450) and Stuart Walker (\pounds 1500). For the second year running Lorraine Kelly, who visited the Falklands a few years ago, donated a dress, which this year was modelled with elegance by Darnell

Christie. The lot also included a tour of the ITV studios and was sold for £300. Government House donated af-

ternoon tea for 8 people which was sold for \pounds 710. The Antarctic Cruise donated by Oceanwide went for \pounds 11,500 and the Baja California Cruise from Lindblad Expeditions went for \pounds 3000. A total of \pounds 22,060 was raised over the 31 lots.

CEO of Falklands Conservation, Esther Bertram thanked supporters as well as many others for their restorative efforts over the years including work undertaken to replant native tussac grass around the islands and the removal of invasive species like rats and spear thistles – introduced species which have been known to disrupt the natural balance of native ecosystems in the Falklands.

References to the ongoing work on New Island were also reflected on, as FC progresses with its New Island Restoration Programme in partnership with Falkland Islands

Government & RSPB – the largest restoration attempt of its kind in Falklands history.

"At FC, our vision is to bring back damaged ecosystems and that is why we are working on our biggest restoration challenge yet on New Island", said Mrs Bertram.

"Unfortunately, we are witnessing large amounts of soil erosion, equating to nine football pitches every year (on New Island). Introduced invasive species like mice, rats and rabbits are also having a harmful effect as they prey on decomposers and eat plant seeds, expediting the erosion that is taking place."
